









## IHRA Members Update 17th July 2020

### 1. Fixtures List 2020

By now, some of you may have seen that the 2020 fixture list has been published on the Portmarnock raceway website and on all social media platforms. This year, for the first time, all three regions will host some form of major event, beginning in August 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> with the Red John Memorial in Lyre for the Cork region. The 2020 Ladies day will take place in Portmarnock on the 27<sup>th</sup> of September. The juvenile stakes finals will take place in Portmarnock on 11<sup>th</sup> October and a week later will see Annaghmore Raceway host the 2020 finals of the 3YO Trotters Championship. A week later, the M50 Skip Hire & Recycling weekend will take place in Portmarnock over the October Bank Holiday weekend.

## 3. Juvenile Series

The first of four eliminators in Ireland, will begin this coming weekend in Portmarnock on this Sunday, while the BHRC eliminators have been moved to July 29<sup>th</sup> in Tir Prince & September 5<sup>th</sup> in York Raceway. In order to keep fairness to all nominations and in light of both Covid 19 restrictions & the BHRC's commitment to Raslab, the IHRA racecourse committee have decided to award all nominated horses, their best three performances to the league table for deciding final points. Finnish equine company, the Black Horses has come on board to sponsor the part of the series and we would like to thank them immensely for their contributions.

# 5. IHRA Protocols Regarding Covid 19:

The main changes to the latest form of the protocols, sees the admittance of children under the age of 12 to attend races (under parental control). In addition, temperature checks will no longer be taken but a full attendee list be recorded for each meeting.

With regards to members traveling to compete at BHRC events, members whilst advised not to travel, may do so but upon returning will need to produce written confirmation from their GP, stating they do not need to self-isolate for 14 days and are free to attend any future fixture without posing a risk the other competitors and IHRA members in attendance.

## 7. IHRA Streaming Service

Any annual subscriptions from 1<sup>st</sup> August will cost €150. You may also wish to pay as you go, the cost per meeting is €10.
